Your cancer and the trial medications

- What is the stage of my cancer?

- Patients in the PATINA Trial must have metastatic breast cancer that is both hormone receptor-positive and HER2-positive (HR+/HER2+). What does this mean? Do I have this type of breast cancer?

- What is endocrine therapy?

- What is anti-HER2 therapy?

- What is palbociclib?

Participating in the PATINA Trial

- What are the potential risks and benefits if I participate in the PATINA Trial?

- How often will I need to go to a doctor's office or hospital?

- What support will be available for my family members and me during the trial?

- Can I talk to other participants in the trial?

- Will I be able to take my regular medications while in the PATINA Trial?

- Can I leave the PATINA Trial if I want to?

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- Is there anything I won't be allowed to do while I am in the PATINA Trial?

Financial costs

- Will I have to pay for anything related to the trial, such as medical tests or medicines? If so, what are the charges likely to be?

- What will my health insurance cover? What questions do I need to ask my health insurance provider?

Privacy and confidentiality

- What will I be told about the trial results if I participate?

- Who will have access to my medical records?
